


LESSON 1 STUDY PRINCIPLES FOR BIBLE PROPHECY

- A. Two sources for knowledge of the future
 - 1. Satan and demon spirits
 - a. Divination, soothsaying, fortune telling, astrology, horoscope, etc. (Acts 16:16-18, II Thess. 2:9-10, Rev. 16:14, II Kings 21:6)
 - b. Condemned by God (Ex. 22:18, Deut. 18:9-14, Lev. 19:26, 31, and 20:6, 27)
 - c. See story of Saul and the witch of Endon I Sam. 28:1-20 and I Chron. 10:13-14. God is serious about this.
 - 2. God, the Holy Spirit and the Word of God
 - a. Spirit will show you things to come (John 16:13)
 - b. In Christ is all knowledge (Col. 1:9, and 2:3)
 - c. We are blessed to receive prophecy from the Bible (Rev. 1:3 & 22:10)
- B. Testing the source or the prophet
 - Does it lead toward God or away from Him? (Deut. 13:1-3)
 - 2. Does it come to pass 100% of the time? (Deut. 18:21-22)
 - 3. Fact that the writings of Bible prophets were preserved by the Jews for so long prove that they were 100% accurate.
 - 4. Death was the Old Testament sentence for an inaccurate prophet.
 - 5. Fulfilled prophecy gives us confidence of our security in God's Word concerning the future.
- C. Second coming of Jesus is the most important event of the future.
 - 1. All significant events of the future revolve around His return just as past events gain their significance from their relationship to his first coming.
 - 2. We are confident of His return based on

Bible prophecy because of the perfect fulfillment of the prophecies for his first coming.

- a. His family
 - 1. Descendent of Abraham (Gen. 22:18)
 - 2. Son of David (I Chron. 17:11-14)
- b. His mother a virgin (Is. 7:14, Luke 1: 26-35)
- c. The place of birth Bethlehem (Micah 5:2, Luke 2:4-7)
- d. His death (Is. 53)
 - 1. Died with the thieves (vs. 9)
 - 2. Buried with the rich (vs. 9)
- e. The betrayal (Zech. 11:12-13, Matt. 26:14-15, 27:3-10)
- f. His crucifixion (Psalm 22, John 19: 23-24, 34)

We know only in part

- 1. See thru a glass dimly (I Cor. 13:9, 12)
- 2. Be careful of making assumptions (Matt. 24:30)
- 3. Don't spiritualize when the scripture has a clear literal meaning.
- 4. Let scripture be interpreted by other scripture.
- 5. Look for patterns in the scriptures; God does not change. He deals with people using same principles in all ages. (Mal. 3:6, James 1:17, Rom. 15:4, I Cor. 10:11)

Knowledge is increasing as the end nears.

- 1. Prophecy is sealed until end times (Dan. 12:4, 9, 10, Rev. 22:10)
- 2. God will make his people aware in time (Gen. 18:17, Amos 3:7)

- Apocalypse prophetic revelation or uncovering
- B. 3. Eschatology doctrine of last or final things
 - 4. Resurrection when dead bodies rise again to life & eternal bodies
 - 5. Rapture when the church, the bride of Christ, is snatched up or caught away from the earth to be with Jesus forever.
- 6. Tribulation time of distress and suffering c. on earth like has never been known before. God's wrath is poured out upon unbelievers.
 - 7. Antichrist the incarnation of Satan who masquerades as the Christ. Anti means opposite and against.


LESSON 2 ISRAEL - KEY TO THE FUTURE

- A. Restoration of the Jewish nation to the land of promise permanently
 - In latter days Israel will return and be established as before. (Jer. 30:1-24 esp. 3, 10-11, 18-24)
 - 2. God will gather them out of the nations and the land will prosper. (Ezek. 36:1-38 esp. 8;12, 20-38)
 - 3. God will plant them & they will not be removed again (Amos 9:8-15)
- B. All Israel to be saved (Romans 11)
 - 1. Apostle Paul said God wasn't finished with the Jews (vs. 1 & 2)
 - 2. They have stumbled (vs. 11-12, see also I Peter 2:8)
 - 3. God made an everlasting covenant with the Jews (vs. 25-31)
- C. The fig tree parable
 - 1. Jesus used the fig tree as an example (Matt. 24:32-24)
 - 2. Fig tree also used in scripture to symbolize Israel (Luke 13:6-9, Hosea 9:10)
- D. Antichrist and Israel
 - 1. The antichrist covenants peace with Israel before the end (Dan. 9:27)
- E. Must be a temple in Jerusalem
 - Antichrist sits in it before end (II Thess. 2:4)
 - 2. Sacrifices cease so they must first begin again (Dan. 9:27)
 - 3. Jesus confirmed this prophecy (Matt. 24:15)
 - 4. Temple must be on the original site (Deut. 12:10-14)
- F. Israel to be a problem to the whole world 1. A burdensome stone (Zech. 12:2-3)

- 2. In the latter years war is to come against Israel (Exek. 38:8, 14-16)
- G. Gentiles time will be over
 - 1. Time of the Gentiles fulfilled in God's plan (Luke 21:24)
- H. Daniel's seventy weeks
 - 1. This is the key to much Bible prophecy (Daniel 9:20-27)
 - 2. This prophecy concerns Jews, not Gentiles (vs. 24 "thy people and....thy holy city")
 - 3. God's timetable for dealing with Jews until the end of the age (vs. 24)
 - a. "make an end of sins"
 - b. "bring in everlasting righteousness"
 - c. "anoint the most Holy"
 - 4. We know from history when the timetable begins (vs. 25)
 - a. 445 BC (Heh. 2:1-8)
 - 5. Weeks means sevens in the Hebrew
 - a. Seventy sevens or 490
 - b. 490 years not days weeks or months
 - 69 weeks (sevens) of years =
 483 years (vs. 25)
 - 2. Messiah crucified (cut off) at that time
 - 3. Last "week" is seven years (vs. 27)
 - 4. Half of that week is
 - a. 42 months (Rev. 13:5)
 - b. 1260 days (Rev. 12:6)
 - 6. Intervening time between 69th and 70th "week" is dateless church age (Eph. 3:3-11)

LESSON 3 THE RAPTURE OF THE CHURCH

- A. Promise of Jesus (John 14:1-3)
 - 1. Prepare a place for us
 - 2. Come again
 - 3. Receive us unto himself
 - 4. We will dwell with him
 - 5. Spoken for our comfort so we would not have troubled hearts (vs. 1)
 - Paul calls this coming "that blessed hope" (Titus 2:13)
- B. What is the rapture?
 - 1. Literally a "taking away" or a "snatching out"
 - 2. Refers to the catching away of the church out of the world
 - Distinguished from the coming of Jesus to the earth to establish his kingdom a. Rapture
 - 1. Like thief in the night (I Thess. 5:2)
 - 2. Without warning (Matt. 24:42-44)
 - 3. For those in Christ (I Thess. 4:16-17)
 - 4. He'll not come to earth, but to the clouds (I Thess. 4:17)
 - b. Revelation
 - 1. For all to see (Rev. 1:7)
 - 2. With many warnings (Matt. 24: 29-30)
 - 3. To smite the nations and judge the earth (Rev. 19:11-21)
 - 4. He'll come to the earth to rule (Zech. 14:3-9)
- C. What happens at the rapture? (I Thess. 4:13-5:11)
 - 1. Spirits of dead believers will come with Jesus (I Thess. 4:14)
 - a. Their bodies will be raised from the grave eternal and incorruptible (I Thess. 4:16, I Cor. 15:42-44, 52)

- 2. Living believers will have their bodies changed instantly to eternal glorified bodies (I Thess. 4:17, I Cor. 15:51-55)
- 3. In the twinkling of an eye (I Cor. 15:52)
- 4. By the power of the Spirit (Rom. 8:11)
- 5. Our bodies will be like Jesus' (Phil. 3: 20-21)
 - a. The same (John 20:20)
 - b. Yet different (John 20:14)
 - c. Able to pass thru physical objects (John 20:19)
 - d. Yet able to be felt (John 20:27)
 - e. Able to eat (John 21:13, Luke 24:43)
 - f. Having flesh & bone (Luke 24:39)
 - g. Not limited to earth by existence (Acts 1:9)
- 6. Transfiguration a preview (Luke 9:28-36)
 - a. Change in countenance and clothing (vs. 29)
 - b. Conversing with other spirit beings (vs. 30)
- 7. John's experience a preview (Rev. 4:1ff)
 - a. Raptured saint goes to heaven immediately (vs. 2)
 - b. Unhindered revelation of God (vs. 2-3)
- 8. Will happen at the same time on both sides of the world (Luke 17:34-36)
 - 9. Marriage supper of the Lamb follows and believers will receive their rewards (Rev. 19:7, II Cor. 5:10, I Cor. 3:13-14)
- D. Who will go in the rapture?
 - Those that are Christ's (I Cor. 15:23)
 a. The bride (II Cor. 11:2, Eph. 5:25-32)
 b. All born-again believers (II Cor. 5:17)
 - Those that continue to the end (Matt. 24: 13, Rom. 11:22, John 8:31, Col. 1:23, Heb. 3:6)
 - 3. Bible does not teach you must be baptized in the Holy Spirit to make the rapture. The New Birth is the ticket (John 3:3)
 - 4. Meditate on:
 - a. II Tim. 4:8 "...that love his appearing"

- b. Titus 2:12-13 "...looking for that blessed hope"
- E. When will rapture take place?
 - 1. It is future has not happened yet (see II Thess. 2:1ff)
 - Could happen any time without further warning (Matt. 24:42-44)
 - 3. Prior to the Great Tribulation
 - a. The tribulation is the outpouring of the wrath of God (Rev. 6:16-17, 15:1, 7, 16:1, 19:15)
 - 1. God's wrath is meant for his enemies (Nahum 1:2, Col. 3:6)
 - 2. We are his friends (John 15:15)
 - 3. Saints are not appointed to wrath but reward (I Thess. 5:9, Rev. 11: 18)
 - b. The tribulation is God's judgment on the unbelieving of the earth (Rev. 16:5-8, 14:7)
 - 1. But saints have passed from judgment (John 5:22-24)
 - c. Promise of Jesus to the faithful church (Rev. 3:10)
 - d. Pattern of God's outpouring of wrath in the past
 - 1. Jesus said to look to the past patterns (Luke 17:26-30)
 - a. Noah and the flood (Gen. 6&7)
 - b. Lot and Sodom (Gen. 18 & 19)
 - 2. Pattern is thus:
 - a. Warning to everyone the righteous and wicked
 - b. Clear separation of the righteous from the wicked
 - c. Righteous evacuated
 - d. God's wrath is poured out as judgment upon the wicked and unbelieving
 - e. The church is conspicuously absent from the Bible account of the tribulation (Rev. 6 19)

- 1. In chapters 1 3 of Revelation, the church is mentioned 19 times; not mentioned again until chapter 22.
- 2. In chapters 2 & 3, seven times is the warning "He that hath an ear let him hear" given to the churches. In chapter 13, the warning is given "If any man have an ear."
- f. It is the Jews, not the church in need of protection during the tribulation.
 - Warning to flee is to those in Judea (Matt. 24:16)
 - 2. Only Jews would be concerned about Sabbath day travel (Matt. 24:20)
- g. Christians may undergo persecution and distress in this world (John 16:33) but they will not suffer the outpouring of God's wrath in the great tribulation. Of course, those who come to Jesus during the tribulation period will witness these tragedies and be martyred.

 - 2. After the church is raptured
 - 3. Temple will be built when peace comes
- D. Chronology of events (Rev. 5 19)
 - 1. Seven sealed scroll (Rev. 5:1)
 - a. God's plan for the end of the age now revealed (Dan. 12:4, 9)
 - b. Jesus the only one worthy (entitled) to open the scroll (Rev. 5:3-14)
 - . A legitimate redeemer (Boaz was a type of Jesus see Book of Ruth)
 - 1. Next of kin son of man (John 5: 27)
 - 2. Willing he lay his life down willingly (John 10:18)
 - 3. Able he has the means and the authority (Luke 11:22, Col. 2:15, Eph. 1:21-23)
 - 2. Seven seals opened (Rev. 6:1-8:1)

 - 3. Angels preaching from the heavens (Rev. 14 6-12)

 - a. Little horn (Dan. 7:8, 8:9)
 - b. King of fierce countenance (Dan. 8:24)
 - c. Prince that shall come (Dan. 9:26)
 - d. Man of sin (II Thess. 2:3)
 - Son of perdition (II Thess. 2:3) e.
 - that Wicked (II Thess. 2:8) f.
 - Beast out of the sea (Rev. 13:1)
- B. Where does he come from?
 - 1. Out of a revived Roman Empire
 - a. Seven heads are the seven-hilled city of Rome (Rev. 13:1, 17:3 & 9)
 - b. Same nationality as those who destroyed Jerusalem after Jesus died (Dan. 9:26)
 - c. A 10 nation confederation (Dan. 7:24, Rev. 17:12-13)
- C. Where does he get his power?
 - 1. From Satan the dragon (Rev. 13:2 & 4, 17:8) he receives spiritual power
 - 2. Earthly power is given to him by the heads of nations (Rev. 17:12-13)
 - World will be prepared by chaos to crown 3. Antichrist world ruler
- What will he be like?
 - Angel of light (II Cor. 11:14)
 - Understand mysteries (dark sentences) and solve problems (Dan. 8:23)
 - Cause prosperity and peace (Dan. 8:25) 3.
 - 4.5. Blaspheme God (Dan. 7:25, Rev. 13:6)
 - Kill saints (Dan. 7:21, Rev. 11:7)
 - 6. Extremely powerful (Dan. 8:9-11, Rev. 13:7)
 - 7. Selfish & self-exalting (Dan. 11:36-37)
 - Raised from the dead?? (Rev. 13:3) 8.

- 9. Worshipped by the world (Rev. 13:8)
- 10. Some Jews will receive him as Messiah (Jn. 5:43)
- E. Unholy trinity (Rev. 16:13-14)
 - 1. Dragon (Satan) imitates God the Father (Rev. 13:2 & 4, 12:9)
 - Beast (Antichrist) imitates God the Son (Rev. 13:2-3)
 - 3. Second Beast (False Prophet) imitates God the Holy Spirit (Rev. 13:11 & 13)
 - a. Performs miracles (Rev. 13:13-14)
 - b. Directs worship toward Antichrist (Rev. 13:12)
- F. Abomination of desolation middle of Daniel's 70th week
 - 1. Daniel prophesied it (Dan. 9:27)
 - 2. Jesus confirmed it (Matt. 24:15)
 - 3. Paul explained it (II Thess. 2:3-4)
- G. Mark of the beast (Rev. 13:15-18)
 - 1. Required for all (vs. 16)
 - 2. Forbidden by God (Rev. 14:9-11, Lev. 19:28)
 - 3. Physical death the penalty for not receiving the mark (Rev. 13:15, 20:4)
 - 4. Spiritual death the penalty for receiving the mark (Rev. 14:10-11)
 - 5. Clear cut choice for all last hope for salvation
 - 6. Opposite the seal of the Holy Spirit (Eph. 1:13, Rev. 7:3, 9:4)
- H. Final destiny
 - 1. War with Jesus (Rev. 19:19)
 - 2. Defeated and cast into the lake of fire with false prophet for eternal torment (Rev. 19:20)

LESSON 6 TWO BABYLONS FALL

- A. Rise of apostasy near the end of the age
 - 1. Falling away from the truth (II Thess.2:3
 - Apostasy is desertion of principles or faith
 - Unbelief and man's programs will replace God's Word
 - c. Form of godliness but no power II Tim. 3:1-5
 - d. Lots of intellectualism but no truth II Tim. 3:7
 - 2. False teachers in the church
 - a. Introduce heresies (II Peter 2:1-2)
 - b. Mockers of the truth (II Peter 3:3-4
 - c. Deceivers who deny deity of Jesus (II John 7, I John 2:22-23)
 - 3. Lukewarmness (Rev. 3:14-18)
- B. Sin will abound
 - 1. Selfishness & pleasure (II Tim. 3:1-4)
 - 2. Drugs and pornography (Rev. 9:21)
 - 3. Idolatry (Rev. 9:20)
- C. Counterfeit church appears
 - 1. True church is gone in the rapture only false ones remain
 - 2. The remaining visible church will be apostate and without the power of God.
 - 3. Ecumenical movement will have brought most of the remaining religions together into a world-wide religious body.
- D. Mystery Babylon (Rev. 17)
 - 1. True church called:
 - a. Wife (Rev. 19:7)
 - b. Chaste virgin (II Cor. 11:2)
 - c. The bride (Rev. 21:9)
 - 2. End time church called "the great whore" (vs. 1)
 - 3. Will not be a weak Christianity but a religious system based on that of ancient Babylon. (Mystery Babylon = religion of

Babylon)

- a. Nimrod founds Babylon (Gen. 10:8-10)
- b. Tower of Babel built (Gen. 11:1-9)
 - 1. Intended to study the stars and for pagan worship
 - 2. Description of tower discovered in 1876 shows shrines to gods around base and sanctuary for Bel-Merodach and signs of zodiac on the top.
- Babylonians believed stars control man's destiny
- d. Their religion was:
 - 1. Astrology (Is. 47:1, 12-13)
 - 2. Witchcraft
 - 3. Occult
- e. Continued thru Daniel's day (Dan. 2:2, 10, 27)
- f. This religion passed from kingdom to kingdom even to Roman Empire - augers, etc.
- g. On the rise again today
- 4. Symbolism in Rev. 17
 - a. Great whore (vs. 1) = woman (vs. 3)
 Mystery Babylon (vs. 5), city (vs. 18)
 - b. Many waters (vs. 1) = control over many people (vs. 15)
 - c. Fornication (vs. 2) = spiritual
 adultry (James 4:4)
 - d. Drunk (vs. 2) = unable to think clearly or rationally
 - e. Beast (vs. 3) = revived Roman Empire ruled by Antichrist (vs. 8)
 - f. Gold and jewels (vs. 4) = great wealth and influence
 - g. Drunken with blood of saints (vs. 6) = guilty of martyring true believers
 - h. Seven heads (vs. 3) = seven mountains (vs. 9) Rome
 - i. Ten horns (vs. 3) = Ten kings (vs. 12)
- 5. This religious system is most likely to be headquartered in Rome.
- 6. Will be in league with Antichrist (sitteth

- on (Rev. 17:3 & 7)
- 7. Antichrist will turn on her (probably at mid-tribulation and destroy her when he sets himself up as God in Jerusalem temple (Rev. 17:16-17)
- E. Another Babylon (Rev. 18)
 - 1. This one a literal city (Rev. 18:17-19)
 - 2. Not the same as Mystery Babylon (compare Rev. 17:16 & 18:9)
 - 3. A city of great commerce and trade (Rev. 18: 11, 15, 17)

 - 2. Not likely that a rebuilt Babylon is referred to in Rev. 17 & 18.
 - 3. If it is rebuilt, it will be ultimately destroyed according to Is. 13:19-22.
- G. Sequence of events
 - 1. Christians go in the Rapture
 - 2. Occultic, Satanic religion takes over
 - 3. So strong it dominates (sits on) the government (beast)
 - 4. Whore and beast are lovers for a time it suits both their purposes and Satan's
 - 5. Wicked, rich & oppressive
 - 6. Antichrist (powerful now) sets himself up as god.
 - 7. He destroys the whore.
 - 8. Antichrist is worshipped as god for 3½ years
 - 9. God's judgments are poured out on the earth
 - 10. Antichrist's government & city of power are destroyed by God at the end.
